Most years have more than 50 dates on which you can pass an exam, so it's pretty easy to find a test day that works for your schedule. For students under the age of 18, it is recommended that you bring your parent or guardian with you on the day of the test. If you are 15 years old or below, you and your parent/administrator must present a valid ID in the test center. TOEFL Scores - How are they calculated? Each section shall be scored individually from 30 June 2007. Then the results are combined for the final score of 120. For speech and writing sections, each task is achieved on a scale of 0-4 (voice) or 0-5 (writing). Internationally, the average TOEFL score is 82. Most universities set a minimum acceptable rating that differs for each school. The minimum acceptable grades are significantly higher for applicants at graduate level. Although your target score will largely depend on the type of university you want to attend, a score of 94 or higher will put you in the top 25% of all test participants. TOEFL FAQs TOEFL scores range from 0 to 120. Four departments are on a scale of 0 to 30. Four sections include reading, listening, speaking and writing.
